What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. ASB & Criminal Damage Willerby
- 2. ASB Anlaby
- 3. Scams and Crime Prevention



Here's a summary **of just some** of the crimes that have been reported across all Wards last month:

Residential Burglary reports: (ten reports across both Wards last month)

6/4/24 – Wolfreton Lane, entry gained entry to rear garden bar by forcing the outer door, once inside steal sporting memorabilia, which was later returned.

6/4/24 – Wolfreton Lane, persons not known to the victim attend and enter garage by means unknown, nothing at this time appears to have been stolen. Footage from another neighbour's property whose garage had also been tampered with shows two small looking suspects trying the garage door and both wearing gloves.

6/4/24 – Wolfreton Lane, attempt entry to garage after suspect try with unsuccessful results causing damage to fence panel on exit.

7/4/24 – Gloucester Road, Hanoi burglary after victim has parked company vehicle outside the front of their property, suspects have entered house by taking out the lock, and taken car keys before stealing said car from the driveway. Vehicle has since been recovered by police and enquiries continue.

8/4/24 – Ferndale Avenue, Hanoi burglary, victim has awoken and discovered that their vehicle keys had been disturbed through and untidy search, stealing vehicle, and Audi from the drive as well as taking a another set of keys for a Mercedes that the victim also owns. Following extensive enquiries one adult male has been arrested and charged for the offence and enquiries are still ongoing.



9/4/24 – Wolfreton Lane, attempt entry to property after suspects are seen to climb over victims' fence and try rear door, believed to be the same suspects from previous burglary reports and enquiries ongoing.

22/4/24 – Mortimer Avenue, Anlaby, residential burglary to property stealing items from within. Named suspect and enquiries underway.

25/4/24 – Scarrington Crescent, Hanoi burglary after suspect's have gained entry via the rear patio door, taken keys for two vehicles before making off with said vehicles. Following extensive enquiries suspect has been arrested with bail conditions and enquiries continue.

30/4/24 – Westborough Way, victim has woken up to a tapping noise within the property before going down to investigate. The door handle to the side of the property has marks and slight damage where forced entry has been attempted.

30/4/24 – Lowe Place, suspects have approached victims dwelling and have attempted to gain entry by forcing rear door handle causing damage, but no entry gained.

Business burglary reports: (no new reports)

Thefts: (eight reports across both Wards last month)

- 5/4/24 Waitrose, Grange Park Lane, shop theft
- 9/4/24 Bernadette Avenue, Anlaby, theft from vehicle, golfing equipment
- 14/4/24 Willerby News, shop theft named suspect and enquiries ongoing.
- 14/4/24 One Stop, Hull Road, shop theft

15/24 – Pryme Street, Anlaby, theft from vehicle, work tools and cash



17/4/24 – Springfield Way, theft from vehicle, personal items stolen from within.

17/4/24 – Hull Road, Anlaby, vehicle interference after 4 x males post on social media that they are going to go graffitiing, males are later seen by on duty police officers trying door handles of parked vehicles. All four males were detained, and wire cutters found on one of the males resulting in their arrest with two receiving police bail whilst enquiries continue.

18/4/24 – Iceland, Springfield Way, shop theft, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

Damage: - (two reports across both Wards last month)

6/4/24 – Haltemprice Leisure Centre, unknown group of youths have thrown unknown items towards victim whilst travelling causing the windscreen to smash.

12/4/24 – McDonalds, Grange Park Lane, criminal damage caused by young suspects entering restaurant and causing damage to several items before then climbing over the fencing and damaging it.

Other (over twenty-one other investigations) These include assault, harassment, and public order, malicious communications to name just a few.

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

1. ASB Group and Damages and ASB Willerby. A small group of individuals have been identified as being involved in pockets of ASB in the Willerby area. Ranging from general nuisance in shops to damage being caused in relation to offences committed. Presentations have taken place at Wolfreton School with Year 9's. The whole year group has now been spoken to and have been given information



about the consequences of Anti- Social-Behaviour and criminality in their communities. Patrols will continue to show high visibility presence within the areas stated to deter any new offences.

2. Anti-social behaviour Anlaby. During May patrols will increase visibility in the area as a visible deterrent to the groups and individuals causing ASB in the area. We will continue with media appeals via social media along with continuing the strong partnership work with Wolfreton and other local schools to identify offenders.

3. If you feel that you have been scammed and would like to speak to someone face to face, please come into your local police station for a confidential chat. It is highly likely that it will be a known scam and you will not be alone. If your local police station is closed or you are unable to get there promptly, please do not delay. If you have information regarding those responsible for fraud, please contact Crimestoppers on 0800 555 111.
