NEW: New Cycle for Christmas, Follow our security tips

## Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Prevent Residential dwelling Burglaries & vehicle crime
- 2. Reduce ASB improve the quality of life.
- 3. Tackle Rural Crime

*Here's a summary of just some of the crimes that have been reported across all Wards last month:* 

**Residential Burglary reports: (four investigations across Tranby Ward)** 



8/12/23, Residential Burglary, Delius Close, outbuilding broken into, and motorcycle stolen from within.

13/12/23, Attempt Residential Burglary, Legard Drive, suspects have attempted to gain entry via the side door of property causing damage to the door handle in the process.

14/12/23, Residential Burglary, Springhead Lane, unknown suspects have entered victims side garden and located wooden shed, 3 padlocks have been cut by means unknown and stolen high value electric bike from with in along with power tools and angling equipment.

22/12/23, Residential Burglary, First Lane, entry gained to garage, and various power tools stolen from within.

## Business burglary reports: (no investigations)

### Thefts: (four investigations)

4/12/23, Theft, Bernadette Avenue, theft from vehicle and damage to after all windows have been smashed and a few items taken from vehicle.

11/12/23, Theft, McDonalds, Grange Park Lane, theft of cooking oil

17/11/23, Theft, Willerby Shopping Park, theft of vehicle number plate

19/12/23, Theft, Anlaby Primary School, theft of pedal cycle

### Damage: - (three investigations)

1/12/23, Criminal Damage, Springhead Lane, group of 20 or so youths throwing items at victims' property. One male picks up a traffic cone and throws it at the front door causing damage.

18/12/23, Criminal Damage, Maple Close, suspects climb onto the bonnet of the victim's vehicle whilst parked in the street causing damage to bonnet and windscreen.



21/12/23, Criminal Damage, Kingston Road, suspect approaches vehicle and causes damage down the driver side door leaving a deep scratch along the vehicle's door.

**Other** (over 15 other investigations) These include assault, harassment, and public order to name just a few.

## 1. Preventing Residential dwelling Burglaries & vehicle crime

During winter months, it is usual for us to see crimes such as burglary and theft rise, particularly if houses and vehicles are unattended.

Burglars are often opportunistic thieves who prey on houses, garages, sheds, and outbuildings. They seek out any opening that they can take advantage of, specifically doors and windows that are left open or unlocked or are easy to force.

#### Action

During the autumn and winter months, members of our Policing Teams will continue to be out and about providing residents with advice on home security.

### 2. Reduce ASB - Improve the quality of life in the community

This period is always one of our busiest, you will see a clear police presence on patrol in and around your neighbourhood over this period.

#### Action

The Neighbourhood Policing Teams work with our key partners and the community to reduce anti-social behaviour and the anti-social use of motor vehicles. We provide proactive responses to



reports of anti-social behaviour in our neighbourhood Area and are constantly reviewing our patrol strategy to address this. We are working hard with partners to address this and ensure our market towns and rural communities are a safe place to live and work.

## 3. Tackling Rural Crime:

Rural crime is not limited to the farmyard. Serious and organised crime groups are often linked to rural and wildlife crime particularly in relation to theft of agricultural machinery and poaching like hare coursing. Our patrols are reminding farmers to review their security and to keep their properties/equipment safe. In relation to the security of Tractor GPS Receiver and Screens, please visit the Police website for crime prevention advice around MARK IT, REMOVE IT and LOCK IT.

**ACTION:** Operation GALILEO has restarted for the season. Throughout this year we have worked with volunteers on the Rural Watches across the whole of the East Riding to deter rural criminality. In addition, we will utilise all the available technology, crime prevention techniques and assistance from the Rural Crime Team to deter and detect crime.

#### How you can help

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in the area in which we all live and work.

We encourage all residents to call and report any issues where they live so that we can deal with any issues and step up our patrols in that area.

### **Prevention of Crime advice**

If you got or gifted a bike this Christmas, please keep them safe and secure.

Register bikes, new and old, on Bike Register: https://www.bikeregister.com or Immobilise: www.immobilise.com. We also want people to consider some crime prevention advice:

Lots of cycle thefts are committed by opportunist thieves who see unlocked and unattended cycles as a good target to steal.

There are also thieves who target high value cycles using social media to identify possible cycles to steal. To tackle this and minimise the risk these offenders pose, people shouldn't share too many details about their bikes on social media. Also, if you are looking to buy a bike, make sure you are buying from a reputable source.

There are simple steps you can take to ensure that you don't make your bike a target:

🔊 Always lock you bike when you leave it.

Keep bikes always locked, when not in use, in a secure building.



If you are storing your bikes in a shed or garage, secure them with a strong D lock to an anchor point and consider fitting an alarm.

**Remove cycle carriers from your car when they're not in use.** 

Think twice about posting your ride stat results or pictures of your bike on social media sites, especially if your home address can also be viewed. If you use them then check your security settings and set at least a 1000m exclusion zone around your house.

By taking small steps in improving security the public can help prevent and deter thieves.

Make cycle security and registration of your bike a New Year's resolution.
