What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?

Residential Burglary reports: (just two reports across Willerby & Kirkella Ward during March)

3/3/23 Riplingham Road, shed burglary to property stealing a quad bike from within, adult female arrested, and enquiries continue

16/3/23 Kingston Road, garage burglary to property stealing bicycle from within which was later recovered

Business burglary reports: (no new reports made)

Thefts: (a high amount of shop theft across Tranby Ward last month, below are just a few)

1/3/23 Morrisons, shop theft x 10, named suspect for two of the offences and enquiries underway

3/3/23 Sainsburys, The Square, shop theft, named suspect and enquiries underway

11/3/23 Grange Park Lane, theft from vehicle – rear number plates stolen

15/3/23 Bromwich Road, theft from vehicle, work tools taken

Damage: (four reports made across Tranby Ward last month)

18/3/23 Forty Steps, damage caused to vehicle caused by males pushing a shopping trolley in the street causing it to bump into vehicle

19/3/23 Wolverton Road, damage caused to vehicle – passenger front window

Other: A further thirty other investigations reported throughout March. These included harassment, assaults, malicious communications, Public Order, domestic and stalking incidents.

3. Community Priorities for April 2023

Humber talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

Reduce ASB - Improve the quality of life in the community

1. Proactive patrols will continue to monitor Haltemprice Leisure Centre and park area following the ongoing issues surrounding antisocial behaviour and vehicle misuse
2. Ongoing Foot patrols will continue within the area of Wolfreton School and Willerby Square to identify suspects and deal with any offences accordingly
3. Preventing Residential dwelling Burglaries & tackle vehicle crime

Is anybody home?

Lights - You can get plug-in timers for your lamps - and timers for your ceiling lights. Don't just light up the hall. Fool a burglar by lighting up the landing, bathroom, bedroom and living room too. Really fox him by varying the times each light comes on.

Sound advice - Use a plug-in timer for a radio - make it a talk station rather than music.

Windows - Remember to shut all windows, even small and upstairs ones, when you leave the house, in your garden or in the rear of your property. If you're upstairs, close your downstairs windows and if you're planning some time away, get a trusted neighbour to shut the curtains at night. You could return the favour some time!

How to protect your car

Vehicles today are by and large more difficult to steal than ever, unless the thief can access your key or fob to clone them. Keep your keys safe, out of view when at home, and away from your front door. It's not uncommon for car keys to be stolen from inside your home by thieves fishing for them with a stick and hook through the letterbox. When at home keep your car key (and the spare) well away from the car.

Put the keys in a screened or signal-blocking pouch, such as a Faraday Bag
