FRIENDS of ANLABY HOUSE GROUNDS

Anlaby House Grounds lie at the back of Anlaby House with access from Beverley Road, and are an open public space consisting of a woodland and an open grassed area frequented chiefly by dog walkers. It has been mooted that a group to be known as 'Friends of Anlaby House Grounds' be formed with the idea of improving this public space and helping to maintain it. The Parish Council has already installed two bird tables and nesting boxes for birds and bats in this area.



If you are interested in joining such a group please contact the Parish Clerk. The idea would be that if such a group was formed, a representative would bring ideas to the Parish Council and if they were agreed by the Parish Council and ERYC it would be funded by the Parish Council. Members of the group would be expected to actively involve themselves in voluntary improvement work within the grounds of Anlaby House i.e. replenishing bird tables, litter picking, establishing a wetland area, wildflower meadow, picnic benches, bulb planting etc.

We continue to celebrate events such as Remembrance Day and the D-Day anniversary around the parish and this year have purchased more poppy and Tommy silhouettes for the lampposts (which councillors put up and take down), Tommy and Women in War statues and flags for both events.

ENHANCING THE APPEARANCE OF THE PARISH

Parish Councillors have planted a large number of daffodil bulbs throughout the parish and provided a number of trees that local residents and councillors planted in the Aspect development, and on Springfield Way. We are keen to continue this work and any suggestions for locations would be very welcome.





We put forward projects for the Community Payback team and they did a great job at tidying the footpath along Beverley Road from encroaching grass, weeds and bushes making it much easier to use, we will continue to put forward projects for them aimed at enhancing the appearance of the parish and again suggestions are very welcome.

The street furniture items along Springfield Way and up to Trenton Avenue have been cleaned, refurbished and varnished.

Additional litter bins have been purchased and installed to help keep areas clean and tidy, most recently this has been on Bernadette Avenue and the Aspect development.



The Anlaby history board near the bus stop in the centre of Anlaby near the clock has been replaced and tells the history of the village, well worth a read if you aren't aware of the history of the area.

Additional street lights have been purchased in several locations and East Riding Council agreed to refurbish the old style lampposts on St. Peter's Avenue to improve their look and lifespan.

HALTEMPRICE PLAY PARK

A residents survey was conducted following feedback about noise and anti social behaviour, the Police have been involved and are aware of the potential for anti social behaviour in the area.

The results did not show a significant issue but some additional tree planting has been agreed to help shield residents from any noise. The park is well used and a great local asset but only if used appropriately, we will continue to monitor the situation.

Do you know where this is in Anlaby?

This ancient milestone and mounting block is situated on Tranby Lane next to the A164/Tranby Lane roundabout. It has been concealed within the hedge growth for many years.

DEFIBRILLATORS

Another defibrillator has been paid for and installed and a further one is also in the planning stage, we now have a good coverage in key locations in the parish.



ANLABY LITTER PICKERS

Anlaby Litter Pickers goes from strength to strength with a large number of local residents now regularly committing time, unpaid, to help keep the parish as litter free as possible. The Parish Council are very grateful to all those residents who commit their time to help in this way and welcome anyone else who wishes to help.
