#### - The Queen's Platinum Jubilee -

#### PROVISION OF DEFIBRILLATORS

The Parish Council has earmarked funds to provide defibrillators in the parish by providing grants to organisations that can install and maintain them.

Anlaby Park Methodist Church, Anlaby Common, have been the first organisation to apply and install a unit. This has been added to www.defibfinder.uk which shows all units registered with Yorkshire Ambulance Service and will be on the circuit.uk as it is rolled out.

#### ANLABY IN BLOOM

Tree and bulb planting are ongoing projects for the council around the parish to improve the visual impact of the local environment. Funding was successfully applied for and 84 trees have been planted this year and many sacks of daffodil bulbs with further sites planned for next year.
