KEEPING THE PARISH CLEAN AND TIDY

Additional litter bins have been installed and the Parish Council has also been in contact with East Riding Council Officers to encourage a litter pick of the A164 at the edge of the parish and on several occasions in the last few months, chased up litter bin emptying around the parish.

The Council would like to thank the growing number of residents, in addition to Councillors, who are A.L.P.s (Anlaby Litter Pickers). Their fine work has also been acknowledged by Officers of East Riding of Yorkshire Council for the work they have done to help keep the parish clean. A.L.P.s is a loose group of volunteers wanting to improve the local environment. It is a supplement to the work of the East Riding of Yorkshire Council which has a statutory duty to remove litter from public areas.

A.L.P.s is a voluntary association of like-minded people willing

to give at least two hours per month of their time (unpaid) to do something about it. Why not contact the Parish Council Clerk on 01482 657572 if you are willing to litter pick to help maintain standards in the parish, a litter picking tool and bags will be provided.

For residents benefit the East Riding of Yorkshire Council website has online forms to report dog fouling and to report a street or public place that needs cleaning, which can also be reported at the Customer Service Centres.



There have been instances of illegal fly tipping in the ditch outside the Tranby Lane cemetery, usually over a weekend. This is not only illegal but depositing rubbish into a live and running water course can have serious implications. If anyone sees suspicious activity or fly tipping please report it.

CHRISTMAS



The final lights were installed outside St Peter's, the lights now go all the way along from there, along Hull Road past the Common and St Mark's into Anlaby Common. They make a welcoming and striking addition in December.

The Christmas 2017 events were again well attended and enjoyed by young and old and a successful Christmas decoration competition held with Anlaby Primary School.

2018 events are now being planned and details will be on the notice boards and website closer to the time.

ANLABY HOUSE GROUNDS

Additional bird and owl boxes have been installed and further bulbs and native flowers have been planted. It is a lovely area to explore and walk. There is a suggested route for a half hour stroll around Anlaby on the Parish Council website.



Tree planting is an ongoing project for the Council with further sites allocated for more trees to be planted, as is planting of daffodil bulbs and other flowers around the parish and the provision of a two tier planter in Anlaby Common.



PLANNING

All planning applications in the parish are reviewed and recommendations put forward to the East Riding Planning Department, but individuals can also comment via the East Riding Council website, whether this is in support or as an objection.

A number of residents have raised concerns regarding the appearance of the new development at

17 Hull Road, Anlaby. The Parish Council raised these concerns with the Planning Department at County Hall, Beverley. However, unfortunately the concerns were overruled and the unsightly development has gone ahead. If you feel strongly regarding this matter please contact the Planning Department at Beverley.

SNIPPETS

- The removal of under-used recycling bins in the Hull Road car park has freed up much needed parking spaces near our popular local shops. The East Riding of Yorkshire Council has recently extended the car park by converting a piece of adjoining land previously occupied by Council garages. The new 11 space car park is now open for use and represents a valuable parking facility.
- Your Parish Council continues to press Derwent Estates for the provision of a permanent footpath at the corner of Anlaby Retail Park for a common sense access point to the area from Springfield Way.
- The Chairman and other Councillors attend the Remembrance Day Service at St Peter's each year to lay a poppy wreath on behalf of the parish.
- The Parish Council has successfully pressed East Riding of Yorkshire Council for improvements to the footway near the car park entrance of Anlaby Park Methodist Church to alleviate flooding problems.
