## CHRISTMAS 2017



The Christmas events this year will take place on Friday, 1st December, with the Anlaby Village Hall event starting at 5.00 p.m., and the Anlaby Common event at St Mark's at 6.15 p.m. with our seasonal visitor.

The final additional lights will be installed outside St Peter's Church this year, so the lights now go all the way from there, along Hull Road, past the Common and St Mark's into Anlaby Common. They make a welcoming festive addition in December.



### ANLABY SHOPS CAR PARK

The Parish Council has liaised with East Riding Council and Sainsbury's to get the car park cleaned up and the underused recycling bins removed. These had attracted litter and fly-tipping more than recycling over the last couple of years. Sainsbury's have also provided a further litter bin and cigarette bin to help keep their storefront and the car park litter free.



### ANLABY LITTER PICKERS

(ALP's) goes from strength to strength with at least 13 residents, in addition to Councillors, who are a loose group of volunteers wanting to improve the local environment. It is a supplement to the work of the East Riding of Yorkshire Council which has a statutory duty to remove litter from public areas. ALP's is a voluntary association of like-minded people willing to give at least two hours per month of their time (unpaid) to do something about it.

Residents wanting to keep the area litter free, are given a kit to help them clear up their area in the Parish, by the Parish Council, just ring the Clerk, on 657572. Any of the current team that would like more equipment, just ask, since your help is much appreciated.



### A COMMUNITY GARDEN FOR ANLABY!

We were pleased to support the Anlaby Communities Trust (ACT) with their Anlaby Communities Day event in June with representatives of a huge number of organisations welcoming all comers, and several groups provided entertainment during the day and a number of informative displays about the history of Anlaby and Anlaby Common.



ACT volunteers are now starting a great new initiative – a community garden and food growing project, using land next to St. Mark's Church, Anlaby Common. ACT hopes that the garden will be a resource for the community, somewhere for local people and groups to come together, grow things, learn and socialise together. A lot of work has taken place across the summer to transform the neglected patch by clearing it, and a small group of volunteers have planted a small area to start things off. ## ANLABY HOUSE GROUNDS

Efforts are continuing to encourage the general public to use the Anlaby House Grounds for recreational purposes as this area is held in trust for the residents of Anlaby.

Further efforts are being made to facilitate its use without spoiling the 'wild' image.

Your Parish Council arranged for the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to provide us with logs, free of charge, to help mark the paths through the woodland. Unfortunately this project has had to be abandoned as the first logs to arrive were duly put down by the Chairman, at the side of the path, but only lasted a week before they were stolen by a person or persons unknown, to enhance their own garden or for a wood burning stove. Life has its little disappointments and this was one of them. Snowdrops and other native and traditional plants have been planted in the woodland and we hope they do not suffer the same fate.

There is a suggested route for a half hour stroll around Anlaby on the Parish Council website.



### — MARY'S WALK —

The passageway is named in honour of Councillor Mary Kingston who was instrumental in maintaining this Public Right of Way when the Anlaby House and Grounds were redeveloped.

It is hoped that naming this 'cut-through' will encourage people to walk this way and enjoy Anlaby House Grounds which are open to the public.

### — NEWS IN BRIEF —

- It has been agreed to purchase four new village signs to mark the boundaries of the parish, these will add character and reflect the history of the parish.
- Following a survey of Pryme Street residents had concerns over car parking, a number of approaches have been made to East Riding of Yorkshire Council to try and get a positive solution such as a controlled parking zone or resident permits without success. National Holidays have been contacted to request that their customers don't use the street as a car park when they are on their trips.
- Shed and garage burglaries continue to be an issue in the parish and it's not unusual for burglars to use items found in a garden shed to break into your home. Many people underestimate the value of the items they store in their shed, garage or garden. Unfortunately, criminals are fully aware of the value of the goods that some people do store in vulnerable places, so please make sure sheds and garages are secure.

One of the key aims of the Parish Council is to represent your views, as they are important to us and it helps us shape the area you live, work and spend your leisure time in. We are keen to have residents input and feedback on matters of importance to you and your community, if there is something you would like the Parish Council to consider in order to improve the area please give us your views and feedback.
