## Planning

A proposed development plan to build on Anlaby Common green space was strongly opposed by the Parish Council and we are monitoring how the East Riding of Yorkshire Council Planning department are viewing this submission. Likewise the proposed use of the Onslow Street as an access route for potential continued development between Lowfield Road and First Lane was strongly opposed.

All planning applications in the parish are reviewed and recommendations put forward to the East Riding Planning Department, but individuals can also comment via the East Riding Council website, whether this is in support or as an objection, and generally a number of unique individual comments tend to be better received than a petition or group response on planning issues.



## Parking & Traffic

We ask residents and their family, friends and tradesmen to be considerate in how they park, as parking completely or partially on the pavement can obstruct pedestrians, wheelchair and pushchair users and force them to use the road to pass parked vehicles. Parking on the pavement can lead to an offence of obstruction being committed, and it is illegal to park on the pavement/verge by the side of yellow lines. It should be noted that unless you are accessing your property via a dropped kerb it is an offence to drive on the pavement even for a short distance.



The centre of Anlaby is to become a 20mph zone from Grove House/Kwik Fit past the shops and up to St Peter's Church, and into Wolfreton Drive. We are pressing the East Riding of Yorkshire Council to have the disabled bays in the car park by the Hull Road shops repainted as these have almost disappeared, and have been consulting with them about how to improve safety and slow traffic along Hull Road near Anlaby Common and the area around the Primary School.



We welcome the change of access/exit to Morrisons car park and continue to press Derwent Estates for the provision of a permanent footpath at the corner of Anlaby Retail Park for a common sense access point to the area from Springfield Way.

## Local Organisations

A number of donations/grants have been awarded including Anlaby Community Care Association, Anlaby Village Hall, Haltemprice Skate Park Association, Haltemprice Bowling Club, St Mark's Church Hall, 5th Hull Boys Brigade Band, Hull & East Yorkshire Swift Conservation Group. The Parish Council welcome grant requests from charities and non-profit making organisations that benefit residents of the parish, applications can be made by completing a Grant Application form obtained from the Clerk.

## Men in Sheds

Men in Sheds is attracting considerable interest nationally and locally, with around 45 local people expressing an interest in this growing phenomenon aimed at helping provide leisure, relaxation and practical activity.
