**What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities** 

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. ASB
- 2. Burglaries
- 3. Shoplifting

Here's a summary of just some of the crimes that have been reported across all Wards last month:



## **Residential Burglary reports: (one investigation)**

7/2/24 – Saffrondale, Hanoi burglary to property after unknown suspects enters property by the garden, opening locks on the gate and use tools to break lock on conservatory door in order to gain access to the house, once inside steal keys from the unit in the hallway before stealing victims Audi which has since been recovered.

19/2/24 – Hazelbarrow Drive, attempt residential burglary to property after unknown suspect has gained access to victim's back garden by entering via the rear alleyway. Suspect has then attempted the door handle at the rear to gain access with negative results due to a security light being activated resulting in the suspect making off. Enquiries ongoing.

# **Business burglary reports: (one investigation)**

5/2/24 – Springhead Lane, attempt entry to rugby club after suspect has tried one of the metal shutters that leads to the building. The shutter has been raised up about 9" and suspects have not managed to gain entry in the building past the UPVC door behind the shutter.

# Thefts: (three investigations)

1/2/24 – Waitrose, shop theft

1/2/24 – Tesco Express, shop theft

15/2/24 – The Hop Pole, theft of e scooter, unknown persons approach and take victim's mobility scooter which was left unattended outside of the public house.



Damage: - (no new investigations)

**Other** (several other investigations) These include assault, harassment, and public order to name just a few.

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

## 1. ASB

Willerby Retail Park – Reports of youths causing anti-social behaviour in the shops and McDonalds causing harassment, alarm and distress to the staff and customers.

### Action

There will be Proactive high visibility patrolling of the area to give reassurance to the stores of our presence and to deter any issue.

# 2. Reducing Burglaries

During winter months, it is usual for us to see crimes such as burglary and theft rise, particularly if houses and vehicles are unattended.

Burglars are often opportunistic thieves who prey on houses, garages, sheds, and outbuildings. They seek out any opening that they can take advantage of, specifically doors and windows that are left open or unlocked or are easy to force.



# 3. Shoplifting

Following on from previous month's figures with regards to shoplifting on an almost daily basis we have increased visibility in retail areas, namely Willerby Shopping Park and Anlaby Retail Park with positive results. We will continue to carry out hi vis patrols around the key areas.
