Meet the team-

Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) plays a vital role in tackling many of the local issues that matter to you. They are out in your area every day, and always available to offer crime prevention advice or for you to raise concerns with.

Each NPT consists of a dedicated Sergeant, Police Constable (PCs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) all under the command of an inspector. While they may be the ones you see the most, the NPTs do not work alone. They are supported by staff and officers from across the whole Humberside Police force area, and they work closely with local authorities, community leaders and residents to decide the local policing priorities for the area and find useful, long-term solutions.

Our approach is shaped by four key themes: We protect vulnerable people and keep people safe; We are out in your communities, visible, listening and working with you to deliver the services you need; We successfully tackle crime and ASB; We will be there when you need us.

Crimes of note

Residential Burglary reports

1/6/25 Beverley Road, Anlaby, attempt entry to property with negative results. Enquiries ongoing.



Business burglary reports

2/6/25 Bellway Homes, Great Gutter Lane, unknown suspect breaks into show room located in a garage on a new build site by smashing the window. Once inside, search the premise and take numerous items from within before exiting as per entry. No known suspects currently.

<u>Thefts</u>

12/6/25 Waitrose, shop theft on 3 occasions by same suspect on 3 different days, totalling cost of £340. No known suspects or witnesses currently.

17/6/25 Saffrondale, theft from vehicle after unknown person gains entry to victims' vehicle without causing damage, searching glove compartment and stealing papers from within before exiting. Suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

17/6/25 Grimston Road, theft of pedal cycle from front of property, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

15/6/25 Carr Lane, criminal damage caused to rear door of property, one adult male arrested for the offence and enquiries ongoing.

17/6/25 Wolfreton Road, unknown male approaches victim's vehicle which is parked and secure at the rear of address and attempts to open the door using the handle, no entry gained and male offender tries other doors on other vehicles at the location. Enquiries ongoing. 17/6/25 Grimston Road, theft of pedal cycle from front of victim's property, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

Community Priorities June 2025

• Retail Theft

Shop theft continues to be an ongoing issue and throughout the coming weeks we will continue to hole police surgeries in retail to provide a visible presence and a point of contact for members of the public and for shop staff. There will also be high visibility patrolling of retail areas.

Anti-social behaviour

The summer months will undoubtedly see a rise in reports of ASB and therefore we will continue to deliver high visibility patrols to hot spot areas. We will also continue to engage with schools to identify any youths involved.



• Operation Coastline

Whether you're planning a seaside stroll, enjoying a picnic by the shore, or visiting local attractions, our coastal towns and villages are filled with springtime activities. However, this busy season can also present opportunities for crime and antisocial behaviour. To help keep communities safe, local neighbourhood policing teams, the Rural Task Force, and the Community Safety Unit will be out on high visibility patrols and engaging with those across the area. Our Roads Policing unit will be actively patrolling key routes, using both marked and unmarked vehicles, to tackle and deter crime and antisocial behaviour.
