
Meet the team-

Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) plays a vital role in tackling many of the local issues that matter to you. They are out in your area every day, and always available to offer crime prevention advice or for you to raise concerns with.

Each NPT consists of a dedicated Sergeant, Police Constable (PCs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) all under the command of an inspector. While they may be the ones you see the most, the NPTs do not work alone. They are supported by staff and officers from across the whole Humberside Police force area, and they work closely with local authorities, community leaders and residents to decide the local policing priorities for the area and find useful, long-term solutions.

Our approach is shaped by four key themes: We protect vulnerable people and keep people safe; We are out in your communities, visible, listening and working with you to deliver the services you need; We successfully tackle crime and ASB; We will be there when you need us.

Crimes of note

Residential Burglary reports

7/5/25 Orchard Cottage, suspects have gained entry to the property which is currently under renovation and have smashed the door to the conservatory at the rear of the house. Once inside several power tools have been taken and keys for a digger and dumper which were parked in the rear garden have also been taken. There are no known witnesses and no CCTV showing the incident. House to house was also conducted which provided no further evidence. Incident has therefore been closed pending any further evidence.

19/5/25 Kingston Road, attempt residential burglary to property after two youths have been disturbed removing a lock from the side door to the house to gain entry with negative results and running off. Enquiries are ongoing.

21/5/25 Beverley Road, Kirkella, residential burglary to garage, push bike stolen from within. No known suspects and log closed pending any further intelligence.



25/5/25 Kingston Road, residential burglary to property that is currently on the market after two juvenile females and one adult female approach the front of location address and smashes the glass in the front door, opens door and gains entry to property, once inside removes light bulbs from the address before being disturbed by the cleaner. Enquiries ongoing.

9/5/25 Lounge, South Ella Way, multiple thefts of used cooking oil from business over a period. No known witnesses or suspects and enquiries ongoing.

22/5/25 Springfield Way, theft of pedal cycle. No known suspects and enquiries ongoing.

22/5/25 St Peters Avenue, theft from victim's vehicle, stealing personal belongings from within.

23/5/25 South Ella Way, theft of waste cooking oil from premise. Suspects unknown and enquiries ongoing.

30/5/25 Earle Street, Anlaby, two suspect males have been seen making attempts to access multiple parked vehicles, before gaining access to one spending times inside the vehicle before making off after being disturbed. Suspects have been arrested and enquiries are underway.

3. Road Safety

Improving safety of our roads across the East Riding



You've no idea what's around the corner so slow down and give yourself time to react.

Be ready to meet cyclists and slow-moving vehicles when you least expect them on rural roads.

If you're out for a country drive, look out for other road users. Don't forget to "LOOK, LOOK & LOOK AGAIN" for those on two wheels.

Remember to share the road and we ask drivers to look out for Walkers, Cyclists and Horse Riders – Give them plenty of room









CYCLE SECURITY

• You should invest in quality locks. As a guide, spend at least 10% of the value of the bike. Most cycles stolen in Humberside are locked with cheap locks, which have been easily broken or cut.

There are three main type of cycle lock.

- D locks are harder to cut, but only if the metal is hardened steel.
- Chains need to be substantial, thick and made from hardened steel to provide reasonable protection.
- Wire locks and wire loops are lighter and offer less security. Braided wire is by far the strongest due to being harder to cut. Beware of thin wire locks covered by thick plastic sheaths to make them appear strong.
- You should look for locks which have been tested against attack.
