Meet the team-

Your Neighbourhood Policing Team (NPT) plays a vital role in tackling many of the local issues that matter to you. They are out in your area every day, and always available to offer crime prevention advice or for you to raise concerns with.

Each NPT consists of a dedicated Sergeant, Police Constable (PCs) and Police Community Support Officers (PCSOs) all under the command of an inspector. While they may be the ones you see the most, the NPTs do not work alone. They are supported by staff and officers from across the whole Humberside Police force area, and they work closely with local authorities, community leaders and residents to decide the local policing priorities for the area and find useful, long-term solutions.

Our approach is shaped by four key themes: We protect vulnerable people and keep people safe; We are out in your communities, visible, listening and working with you to deliver the services you need; We successfully tackle crime and ASB; We will be there when you need us.

Crimes of note

Residential Burglary reports

15/3/25 Carr Lane, residential burglary to victim's rear shed after unknown suspect has removed the windows to force the door to gain enter. Once inside take two hedge cutters from the shed, one of which is later found discarded.

18/3/25 Voases Lane, attempt burglary to residential property after unknown person attempts to open the front door handle twice with negative results.

19/3/25 First Lane, attempt entry to property after unknown suspect approaches victim's front door and repeatedly tries the door handle to gain access with negative results.

Business burglary reports

16/3/25 Ginos, Hull Road, business burglary to takeaway after unknown suspect has used and object to smash the glass door to enter, once inside depart with cash register and trash kitchen machinery inside before exiting and fleeing the scene. Enquiries in the early stages.

19/3/25 Anlaby Pizza, commercial burglary to takeaway after front door has been boarded up due to burglary 3 days ago. Overnight, boarded door has been damaged, and entry gained by suspect. Suspect steals drill before exiting as per entry. Enquiries ongoing.

Thefts

19/3/25 Anlaby Retail Park, theft of pedal cycle.

29/3/25 Marks & Spencer, shop theft – known prolific offender and enquiries ongoing.



Damage

21/3/25 Legard Drive, damage caused to vehicle by keying bonnet to boot on both sides of vehicle. No known suspects and enquiries ongoing.

22/3/25 Main Street, criminal damage caused to victims' front door by named youths and enquiries ongoing.

26/3/25 Rokeby Avenue – deliberate criminal damage caused to fence panel of property.

30/3/25 Willerby Square Care Park, criminal damage caused to East Yorkshire Bus after 3 youths threw something heavy at the bus whilst it was moving causing a couple of windows to shatter.

Community Priorities April 2025

1. Prevention of Residential burglaries

Operation IRE related to a series of high value burglaries involving theft of safes in the East Riding towards the latter end of last year. Hotspot patrolling was carried out in both uniform and plain clothes capacity. Since this series of burglaries there have been no further which match the modus operandi. This appears to have been a targeted and organised string of burglaries. Patrolling in the area will continue. Reassurance visits have been carried out throughout affected areas along with crime safeguarding advice and advice on installing security cameras/alarms.

2. Improving Road Safety – Speed Enforcement

Reports have been made to us regarding speeding in the local area, namely Springfield Way and Lowfield Road. Humberside has recorded a high number of fatal road traffic collisions with 7 fatalities within the first 10 days of January. We



have carried out speed enforcement with the Pro Laser in areas identified to us as repeat areas for speeding. This has included areas around schools in conjunction with the Safer Streets scheme. In all locations that this has been carried out we have not measured any vehicles exceeding the speed limit.

Speed has continued to be highlighted as an issue throughout ward area so will continue to be a priority for the next beat plan.

3. Retail Theft

We have continued to engage with retail premises throughout this period. This has involved high visibility patrolling and engagement, alongside surgeries being held inside retail premises. Between 1st February 2025-28th March 2025 there have been 28 reported shop thefts throughout Willerby/Kirk Ella and Tranby. This will continue to be a priority area moving forward due to the increase in shop theft incidents. We will continue to hold surgeries and will conduct more foot patrol in retail areas.

Other news

Shielding victims of domestic abuse

Forty-three people have been arrested on suspicion of Domestic Abuse offences so far as part of our continued commitment to tackle those harming our community through Operation Shield.

Of these, twelve have been charged and remanded with offences including assault, harassment, stalking, public order, breaching of domestic violence protection, or non-molestation orders, and are now going through the judicial process.

Crime Prevention Advice SHEDUCATION



At this time of year when spring arrives and the clocks go forward, Burglaries of sheds and garages usually start growing! The police together with Neighbourhood Watch Groups are asking for your help. The value of property in sheds and garages is more than people think. Thieves are targeting them for power tools, cycles and sports equipment. Hand tools are stolen and used to break into homes.



Let's weed out these thieves by getting some **sheducation! S**ecure the access to your shed or garage by locking gates and using thorny bushes.

Have you visibly marked the contents of your shed? Note of serial numbers, take photos.

<u>E</u>xternal security lights which are activated by movement are a useful deterrent.

<u>D</u>oors of sheds require attention. Use strong hasp/staples and close shackled padlocks.

 $\underline{\textit{\textbf{U}}}$ se coach bolts or non-return screws to secure door hinges.

 $\underline{\textbf{\textit{C}}}$ hain cycles, mowers, ladders and tools to a strong anchorage point.

Alarms for sheds and garages are available for under £20 at most DIY stores.

<u>Together we'll crack crime</u>. Join a home watch scheme.

<u>Exactly</u> what insurance cover do you have? Check that your household policy covers you for theft from your garden and outbuildings.
