1. CRIME & ASB

What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?

Residential Burglary reports: (six reports made across both Wards during January)

5/1/23 Marshall Avenue, entry gained to property, stealing key fob and Yale key from insecure premise, suspect known and enquiries ongoing

12/1/23 Victoria Avenue, entry gained to property and a number of prehistoric artefacts taken

13/1/23 Lloyd Street, attempt entry to residential garage causing damage in the process

21/1/23 Aston Road, shed burglary stealing various items from within, from an e scooter to a drill and girls pedal cycle

21/1/23 West Green, entry gained via upstairs window and once inside untidy search conducted and various high value items taken from a safe, enquiries ongoing

27/1/23 West Ella Road, residential burglary to premise, enquiries ongoing

3. Community Priorities for February 2023

Humbertalking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

1. Reduce ASB - Improve the quality of life for residents

What is Anti-Social Behaviour?

Antisocial behaviour (ASB) is any conduct that has caused or is likely to cause harassment, alarm or distress to any person. It comes in many forms of behaviour that provoke a range of responses, from mild annoyance to overwhelming fear and insecurity. Incidents may be isolated or within a pattern of behaviour, and ASB can have a devastating effect on the lives of people and their communities.

Depending on the nature of the behaviour, it can be dealt with by the police or the antisocial behaviour team at your local council.

ASB dealt with by police:

The following issues should be reported to police:

- ASB which occurs as part of a criminal offence, for example
Threats to Kill or assault
- Deliberately intimidating and rowdy behaviour by groups or individuals in public spaces and anti-social street drinking
- ASB involving the use of vehicles



Graffiti and vandalism to property

Hate crime - If a person is abused, verbally or physically, because of their ethnicity, religion, sexuality, gender, disability or just because they are different then this is a crime or hate incident

Harassment - Repeated attempts to make unwanted contact with a person and those associated with them, which causes a person distress or fear

You can report these cases of ASB in your area by calling 101 or 999 in an emergency.

ASB dealt with by your local council

The following issues should be dealt with by your local council:

Neighbour or housing related ASB reported to councils in their capacity as social landlords

Environmental noise nuisance

Public space vandalism

Littering/fly-tipping – the illegal dumping of waste

You can report these cases of ASB in your area via the **East Riding of Yorkshire Council website**

2. Reduce Rural Crime

We have defined it as “Any crime and anti-social behaviour that takes place in a rural location”

Examples

- . Burglary
- . Criminal Damage
- . Theft of and from machinery or equipment
- . Poaching or Hare coursing

GPS Security

Farm machinery is a huge investment for a farmer. It needs to be securely stored and protected from opportunist thieves. There are many ways to help keep equipment safe:

MARK IT, REMOVE IT, LOCK IT

Tractor GPS Screens

- Remove screens when not in use – ensure they are left in a safe and secure location.
- Mark screens using Forensic Marking and use the provided stickers to advertise forensic marking is in use
- Record serial numbers

Tractor GPS Receivers

- If not in use, disconnect, remove and secure in a safe location
- Remove from roof if not in use and tractor is being used on road – this will prevent advertising the fact you have a receiver.
- Ensure the software is up to date, and marked with security warning stickers
- Consider securing the tractor in a locked alarmed shed
- Record serial numbers

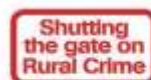
Insurance: Make sure your device is properly insured as it may need to be a separate item on your insurance, especially once removed from machinery. **CCTV:** Consider installing CCTV, intruder alarms, security lighting and boundary security (entrance gates/fencing) around your property to provide formal surveillance and target harden the most vulnerable areas.

Please report any suspicious activity to the police immediately on 999 if there is a crime in progress or 101 for non-emergency incidents.
