What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- Preventing theft
- Reduce ASB, criminal damage.

Here's a summary **of just some** of the crimes that have been reported across all Wards last month:

Residential Burglary reports: (four new reports)

5/6/24 Riplingham Road, whilst occupants are away unknown person has gained entry to residential garage and stolen specialist fishing equipment from within.

23/6/24 Ganton Way, residential burglary to outbuilding stealing various power tools from within.

23/6/24 Hazelbarrow Drive, residential burglary to outbuilding stealing golfing equipment aned fishing gear from within.



24/6/24 Legard Drive Anlaby, attempt residential burglary to unconnected building with negative results.

Business burglary reports: (no new reports)

Thefts: (six new reports)

12/6/24 Co-op, shop theft

16/6/24 Manor Way Anlaby, theft in a dwelling, kitchen utensils and equipment stolen from within. Enquiries ongoing.

19/6/24 Easenby Avenue, theft from vehicle, personal belongings

23/6/24 Main Street Willerby, theft in dwelling, personal items stolen from within.

24/6/24 Tesco Kingston Road, shop theft

26/6/24 Waitrose Willerby Shopping Park, shop theft

Damage: - (three new reports)

10/6/24 Main Street Willerby, criminal damage caused to dining chair after resident was refused allowance which wasn't due resulting in resident becoming frustrated and causing the damage. Enquiries ongoing.

11/6/24 East Riding Council, criminal damage and theft caused to communal garden of flats. Suspect identified and enquiries ongoing.



23/6/24 Marshall Avenue, criminal damage caused to vehicle, front windscreen smashed, enquiries ongoing.

Other (over twenty-two other investigations) These include assault, harassment, public order and malicious communications incidents to name just a few.

1. Preventing Theft

We are aware of concerns regarding Thefts in the ward area.

Action - We have been working hard to provide support and guidance to prevent further offences, whilst completing enquiries to identify and tackle those responsible. We will be completing regular patrols in the areas of concern.

1. Reduce ASB, Criminal damage.

We regularly deploy high visibility patrols to our communities in response to reports of criminal damage, drug dealing and anti-social behaviour involving scrambler bikes and mopeds.

The local policing team have also had productive meetings with partners from East Riding Council, Parish Councils and Neighbourhood Watch groups to listen to community concerns.

We understand how distressing acts of mindless vandalism in our parks and green spaces can be and I want to reassure the community that we take a zero-tolerance approach to anti-social and criminal behaviour.



Our officers are also committed to eradicating the harm that the illegal and anti-social use of off-road bikes cause to the communities through our Operation Yellowfin.

Action - As we enter summer, members of our Policing Teams will conduct regular high-visibility patrols and partnership working is ongoing to make sure that all Wards are a green space for everyone to enjoy as we head into the summer months.

Rest assured, where we receive reports of anti-social and criminal behaviour, we will not hesitate to act. If you witness any such behaviour in your community, please let us know so we can respond, target patrols to the relevant areas and stop criminals in their tracks.
