What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

1. Preventing Residential Burglary – *SHE*EDUCATION
2. Anti-Social Behaviour
3. Road Safety

Here's a summary of just some of the crimes that have been reported across all Wards last month:

Residential Burglary reports: (eight investigations)

5/3/24 – Residential Burglary, Bellfield Drive, suspects gain entry to the victim's property by tampering with the lock on the rear gate. Once inside conduct an untidy search before making off with items of jewellery.

11/3/24 – Attempt Burglary, Rokeby Avenue, suspect male enters complainants garden by jumping over from neighbouring garden and approaches garage and tries to gain entry by trying the door with negative results. Suspect jumps into neighbour's garden and makes off.

11/3/24 – Shed Burglary, Poplar Close, suspects enter shed and walks round inside before making from scene.

12/3/24 – Attempt shed burglary, Spring Gardens, persons unknown approach the victims shed and use unknown force to break the lock to gain entry with negative results but causing damage to the handle in the process.

13/3/24 – Shed Burglary, Rokeby Park, entry gained to garden shed damaging fence and padlock in the process.

14/3/24 – Attempt residential burglary, Hudson Avenue after 3 male suspects enter victims garden by climbing over a fence and trying to gain entry to the property by trying the door handle. Suspects then notice CCTV at the property and leave using the garden gate.

12/3/24 – Garage Burglary – Trafford Road, suspect uses force to remove a padlock to gain entry to victim's garage which is located at the rear of the property. Suspect makes off with fishing equipment to the value of £3000. Enquiries ongoing

19/3/24 – Attempt shed burglary – Bernadette Avenue, three unknown males have climbed over a garden fence and attempted to gain entry to an outside shed which proved unsuccessful.

Business burglary reports: (one investigation)

9/3/24 – Business Burglary to Kirkella Police Station after suspect stated he needed a lift home before proceeding to kick the entrance door to the station, gaining entry and damaging the door before being found inside the station by the attending officer. Suspect is subsequently arrested and charged for the offence.

Thefts: (two investigations)

12/3/24 – Main Street, shop theft, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

12/3/24 – Wolfreton School, theft of pedal cycle.

Damage: - (six investigations)

7/3/24 – Ashdene Close, criminal damage caused to vehicle after unknown suspects attend victims address and throw eggs and other food items on victims' vehicle then cause damage by throwing unknown items causing rear windscreen to crack.

12/3/24 – Ashdene Close, criminal damaged caused to property by smashing pane of two double glazed windows by unknown persons.

19/3/24 – Forty Steps, Anlaby – theft of electric bike after victim left bike down the side of property and discovered it gone sometime later.

21/3/24 – York Gardens – interference with vehicle, group of youths have tried victim's car door handle and boot with unsuccessful results.

24/3/24 – Woodland Drive, interference with vehicle after reports of suspect entering victim's driveway and trying door handles to car with unsuccessful results causing damage in the process.

15/3/24 – Wordsworth Avenue, criminal damage caused to window caused by persons throwing rocks. Enquiries ongoing.

Other (seventeen other investigations) These include assault, harassment, and public order to name just a few.

1. Preventing Residential Burglary – SHEDUCATION

At this time of year when spring arrives and the clocks go forward, Burglaries of sheds and garages usually start growing! The police together with Neighbourhood Watch Groups are asking for your help. The value of property in sheds and garages is more than people think. Thieves are targeting them for power tools, cycles, and sports equipment. Hand tools are stolen and used to break into homes.

Action

During this month members of all three Policing Teams will continue be out and about providing residents with advice on home security.



Let's weed out these thieves by getting some sheducation!

Secure the access to your shed or garage by locking gates and using thorny bushes.

Have you visibly marked the contents of your shed? Note of serial numbers, take photos.

External security lights which are activated by movement are a useful deterrent.

Doors of sheds require attention. Use strong hasp/staples and close shackled padlocks.

Use coach bolts or non-return screws to secure door hinges.

Action

2. Preventing Anti-Social Behaviour

Antisocial behaviour (ASB) is any conduct that has caused or is likely to cause harassment, alarm, or distress to any person. It comes in many forms of behaviour that provoke a range of responses, from mild annoyance to overwhelming fear and insecurity. Incidents may be isolated or within a pattern of behaviour, and ASB can have a devastating effect on the lives of people and their communities.

Depending on the nature of the behaviour, it can be dealt with by the police or the antisocial behaviour team at your local council.

Action

During this month members from all three Policing Teams will continue to be out and about patrolling the community to deter anti-social behaviour along with reassuring the public.

3.Road Safety

As with most other areas, road safety is something in which we can improve upon within our community.

Action

With the return of all children to our primary schools after the Easter Holiday, the Community Teams will be conducting patrols around the schools making sure that the roads are safe for everyone especial for our young members outside the schools' gates.

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in the area in which we all live and work.
