1. CRIME & ASB

What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?

Residential Burglary reports: (just six reports made across both Wards during May)

2/5/23 Pine Meadows, window of unoccupied property has been forced open and smashed, untidy search conducted with nothing believed to have been stolen

13/5/23 Hull Road, Anlaby, attempt entry via the rear garden, once inside suspect approaches the rear UPVC door and attempts to remove the casing around the handle in order to force the lock. Suspect flees before managing to do this, leaving the screw- driver behind.

15/5/23 Delius Close, attempt entry gained to garden shed with negative results

23/5/23 Kingston Road, entry gained to the hallway by means unknown whilst complainants are watching tv. Suspect steals handbag and contents from within before exiting and it isn't discovered until the next day, enquiries are in the early stages

24/5/23 Sherwood Drive, attempt entry to property after occupants are woken by the house alarm and discover the lock to the patio doors have been forced with plate of handle removed.

31/5/23 Pine Meadows, entry gained to property after suspects have snapped the lock on the utility door exterior and gained entry however no search was conducted as suspects were disturbed by occupants resulting in them fleeing from the property. Enquiries underway

Business burglary reports: (just one report made across Willerby & Kirkella Ward last month)

17/5/23 Springboard Nursery, ground floor window to nursery has been smashed and some panels have been moved about inside the nursery. Nothing believed to have been stolen

Thefts: (thirteen reports made across both Wards last month)

5/5/23 Morrisons, Springfield Way, shop theft, suspect named

7/5/23 Sewell on the go, shop theft

14/5/23 Maplewood Avenue, interference with vehicle

14/5/23 Loxley Green, interference with vehicle

16/5/23 Springfield Way, theft of box trailer from property

16/5/23 Sainsbury's, shop theft x 2, adult male arrested

17/5/23 Waitrose, shop theft

22/5/23 East Coast Construction, Well Lane, theft of diesel from vehicle

22/5/23 Main Street, theft from vehicle, wingmirror parts

22/5/23 Well Lane, theft from vehicle, diesel

24/5/23 Lidl, Great Gutter Lane, shop theft

28/5/23 Sweethearts, Hull Road, shop theft

30/5/23 Hull Road, suspect approaches victim's vehicle and smash the front nearside window with an implement similar to a hammer, reach inside and steal wallet containing debit card, credit card before making off and using the cards for several contactless transactions at nearby convenience stores.

Damage: (six reports made across both Wards last month)

2/5/23 Delius Close, damage caused to window

2/5/23 Windsor Avenue, damage caused to vehicle

9/5/23 Setterwood Garth, damage caused to vehicle

15/5/23 Haltemprice Leisure Centre, damage caused to bike cage

26/5/23 Christ Church, South Ella Way, group of youths behaving anti socially, damage boarding at the church

30/5/23 Spring Gardens, unknown suspects climb into victim's back garden and use a large stone in the garden to break the side gate and lock

Other: Over twenty other investigations reported throughout May. These included harassment, assaults, Public Order and blackmail incidents
