What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Anti-Social Behaviour update
- 2. Nuisance/Stolen Motorcycles ongoing.
- 3. Residential Burglaries.



Here's a summary of just some of the crimes that have been reported across all Wards last month:

Residential Burglary reports: (six reports made last month)

3/7/24 Ladysmith Road, residential burglary to unconnected building (garage) stealing Gazelle Esprit cycle from within.

11/7/24 Wolfreton Lane, attempt residential burglary to property after suspects have approached the rear of the property and removed a wooden panel from the rear door, entry has not been gained into the main house.

19/7/24 Kenwardly Road, attempt residential to property after victim has checked camera footage and has noticed during the early hours of the morning that a person not recognised arrived on a stand-up scooter with a ski type mask covering their face and approaches the front door, trying the handle before leaving the area.

26/7/24 Thornwick Avenue, attempt entry to garage after persons approach locked garage containing motorbikes and tools, cause damage to the lock and make off from scene without gaining entry.

29/7/24 Carr Lane, Willerby, residential burglary to property after unknown suspect has entered the victim's home as a trespasser and steal items from within before making off.

30/7/24 Wolfreton Road, Hanoi burglary to property after suspects enter the rear via a kitchen window, stealing two sets of vehicle and then taking both vehicles from outside. Named suspect and enquiries ongoing.

Business burglary reports: (two reports made)



10/7/24 Tranby Lane, attempt business burglary after suspect approaches victim's property at the back from the woodland area. Suspect smashes the victim's security camera and rips out the wiring for the security system/light which activates the alarm which is in the victim's workshop in the back garden. Alarm disturbs suspect and they do not gain entry. Suspect leaves as per entry.

24/7/24 The Secret Village, Anlaby, business burglary after unknown suspects have entered premises by breaking the glass on front door, once inside conduct untidy search before stealing £200 from within and exiting as per entry. Enquiries ongoing.

Thefts: (ten reports made last month)

2/7/24 The Lunds, theft of garden foliage from property.

10/7/24 Kingston Rise, theft of bank cards and money withdrawn from account. Enquiries ongoing.

12/7/24 East Riding Leisure, Haltemprice, theft of pedal cycle

15/7/24 Waitrose, Willerby Shopping Park, shop theft x 2

15/7/24 Lowfield Road, theft from vehicle after unknown person approaches victims locked Berlingo Van which is parked on victim's driveway, enter via the driver's side, and steal a full bag of power tools worth approximately £2500.

15/7/24 One Stop, shop theft, suspects named and enquiries ongoing.

16/7/24 Sainsbury's, shop theft.

25/7/24 Faversham Avenue, theft of motorcycle from back garden by unknown means and later recovered by police. Enquiries ongoing.



30/7/24 Springfield Way, theft from person of another after suspect picks up a handbag that was laid on the floor without permission before leaving with said bag and contents. Enquiries ongoing.

Damage: - (five reports made last month)

3/7/24 Waitrose, Grange Park Lane, criminal damage caused to various items within the store.

5/7/24 Marshall Avenue, criminal damage caused to vehicle after unknown suspects thrown an unknown object at victim's vehicle causing the front nearside window to smash.

12/7/24 East Riding Leisure Centre, Haltemprice, criminal damage caused to Perspex panel after a youth repeatedly kicked the Perspex sheeting on 2 x bike sheds outside the leisure centre. Youth named and enquiries ongoing.

25/7/24 Kingston Rise, criminal damage caused to tomato plants after male urinates on them and trellis causing plants to die. Suspect identified and enquiries ongoing.

31/7/24 Haltemprice Sports Centre, criminal damage caused to moving vehicle after 4 males are standing on each side of the road and throwing rocks at victims' vehicle which has resulted in chips and dents. All males identified and enquiries underway.

Drugs: (one report made last month)

2/7/24 Kingston Rise, one adult male charged and arrested for possession of Class A Drugs (Cocaine) enquiries ongoing.



Other (over several other investigations) These include assault, harassment, public order and malicious communications incidents to name just a few.

Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

1. Anti-Social Behaviour

A small group of individuals have been identified as being involved in pockets of ASB in the Willerby area. There are varying levels of Anti-Social behaviour ranging from general nuisance in shops to damage being caused. We have had some good results from our partnership working with Wolfreton School and the presentations we ran last month. ASB will continue to be on our radar over the coming weeks and months and we will be patrolling in hotspot areas.

2. Nuisance/Stolen Motorcycles – ongoing

Stolen Motorcycles and nuisance logs continue to be on our priority list, and we will maintain a hi viz presence in the areas affected, generally Anlaby Common, Willerby and West Ella as a visible deterrent.

3. Burglaries

Burglaries continue to be high up on our list of priorities and in particular Hanoi style (whereby offenders break into property and steal victim's car keys and car) along with outbuildings such a sheds and garages. Throughout the month of August our patrols will continue high visibility patrolling.




CRIME REDUCTION

Keeping your shed or garage safe and secure!

Many people don't secure their shed or garage in the same way they do their homes - often using an easy-to-break lock or padlock to protect valuable contents such as a car, bike or lawnmower. An opportunistic burglar will try a shed or garage first because they can find the tools they need to break into the main house.

Shed and outbuilding security: first steps







Think like a thief!

Look at your shed and consider how you would break in. It's worth having a good padlock on the door with no exposed screws. Pay attention to hinges, as these are sometimes easily removable. If you have windows, then these could be vulnerable unless they're secured with wire mesh or grills. And keep it always locked.

Alarm it.

Consider a battery-operated shed alarm. They look low key, but they respond to movement or door contact with an extremely loud siren.

Lock it, hide it or mark it.

Don't give them the opportunity or the tools to commit a crime. Lock everything away securely. Tools can be locked inside a locker or box or secured with a chain.

Secure your bike to the ground or a lockable stand within a locked shed or garage. Visit <u>Sold Secure</u> to search for ground anchors and other locks designed to fix to floors and walls.

It's always worth draping an old sheet or blanket over the top of mowers or bikes to keep them covered from view.

Although it might sound like stating the obvious, never leave your garage or shed door unlocked if you're not around. Keep the door closed between uses so that no one can see what's inside.

Property mark your items and take photographs of them. Some tools can be painted with your name or postcode and forensic marking is also an option. You can also register any item that has a serial number with <u>Immobilise</u>.

A locksmith belonging to the <u>Master Locksmiths Association</u> can advise you on the most secure shed and garage door security. They can also help you install it. Most also provide full home security surveys.
