What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities?

Residential Burglary reports: (just three reports across both Wards during April)

9/4/23 Carr Lane, Willerby 'distraction burglary' whereby 3 youths have knocked at the property to elderly victim and have asked if any jobs needed doing, one of the youths has going to the rear of the property and gained entry via an insecure window stealing handbag and contents from within. Named suspects and enquiries underway

15/4/23 Wolfreton Villas entry gained to unconnected building and hand and garden tools stolen from within

24/4/23 Nunburnholme Park, attempt entry gained via the rear of the property causing damage to the lock in the process

Business burglary reports: (just one report made across both Wards last month)

19/4/23 The Trade Yard, Grange Park Lane, entry gained to business premises and computer software stolen

12/4/23 Wolfreton Road, adult male arrested and charged for domestic related criminal damage
14/4/23 Springfield Way, damage caused to vehicle
16/4/23 Delius Close, criminal damage caused to residence, window
27/4/23 St Thomas More Roman Catholic School, criminal damage caused to rear of the school

Other: Over twenty other investigations reported throughout April. These included harassment, assaults, malicious communications, Public Order and stalking incidents.

3. Community Priorities for May 2023

Humber talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

Reduce ASB - Improve the quality of life in the community

We have been working closely with local partners to deal with this problem. When suspects are identified, proportionate action is being taken to hold them to account while also diverting them away from causing further issues. In order to reduce this further we need residents to continue to report incidents and provide the identity of those responsible if possible. We will continue to monitor and patrol the area and assess the impact. We would also encourage the community to report any issues by calling Humberside Police on 101 (non-emergency number) or CrimeStoppers on 0800 555 111.

Will remain a ward priority for May.
