- Public Speaking Mrs. V. Wood attended the meeting to express concerns regarding Anlaby Common and provided members with a briefing on historical issues related to the area. The Chairman reassured residents that the Parish Council's position remains unchanged, confirming its continued opposition to any development on the land, and stated that liaison with Emma Hardy MP will continue. Cllr. Ross Harrison agreed to obtain a copy of the 2010 Local Plan for Cllr. Slingsby. All work being carried out on the Common has been documented by a local resident. Cllr. Slingsby will continue to liaise with the resident with the aim of raising the profile of Anlaby Common.

- Police Report PCSO Jess Watts briefed members on reported crime over the past month. She is currently working with the Manager of Haltemprice Leisure Centre to identify youths causing issues at the site, which has resulted in some individuals being banned. Residents are urged to report any incidents involving youths on electric scooters, including details such as clothing and behaviour. These individuals have been described as aggressive and intimidating, and it is believed that many are from the Hull area. The latest 'Tackling Anti Social Behaviour in our Community' Report had been circulated to members via email.
- 47 <u>Update from Tranby Ward Councillor</u> Cllr. Harrison reported that car parking charges will not be introduced in Anlaby. He also confirmed his willingness to follow up any outstanding issues with East Riding of Yorkshire Council on behalf of the Parish Council. A brief summary of all matters dealt with over the past month was provided.

Minute 28 - The Clerk had not yet received a reply from the Local Police Team about their plans in place to manage school leavers.

Minute 32 (18b) - Cllr. McLeod had submitted several requests to the Community Payback Team and is currently awaiting a response.

Minute 39d - E.R.Y.C. reported that the carriageway improvements at the A164/Tranby Lane roundabout near Swanland are being funded through the Department for Transport's Local Transport Plan Maintenance Fund, which supports repairs to existing infrastructure. However, Swanland Parish Council believed that funding for these works had been agreed as part of the planning approval for 150 houses in Swanland, with the developer identified as Crest Nicholson.

A payment of £479.41 was received from East Riding of Yorkshire Council (E.R.Y.C.) for the VE/VJ 80 Grant.

- b) <u>Finance Report/Bank Reconciliation/Bank Statements</u> The Finance Report to 30th June 2025 was received and approved. Bank statements and the bank reconciliation for the period ending 30th June 2025 were received and duly signed.
- c) Internal Audit Report and AGAR for the year ended 31st March 2025 The Clerk provided an update on actions arising from the Internal Audit Report. Members were advised that an amended Internal Audit form had been submitted to PKF Littlejohn LLP, correcting the petty cash entry and providing an explanation for the 10p error in May 2024 and the corresponding compensating error in June 2024. There was a change within the Practitioners' Guide 2024 which is mandatory for the 2024/25 year: Paragraph 1.26 relates to the requirements in relation to Assertion 3 and states '1.26 Email management every authority should have an email account that belongs to the council and to which the council has access.' In order to answer 'Yes' to Assertion 3 in the 2024/25 (and subsequent years') Annual Governance Statement, the smaller authority must have an email address that complies with this requirement. If it does not already, then this must be obtained A.S.A.P.
- Recommendations by the Parish Council to the East Riding of Yorkshire Council on Planning Applications 10th July 2025
 - FULL PLANNING PERMISSION Erection of a two storey extension to front, single storey extension to side and rear, conversion of existing integral garage to additional living accommodation, and raising of roof height to facilitate construction of 4 no. dormer windows to rear 22 Croft Drive, Anlaby Our comments on the previous application about car parking still stand. This issue is highlighted because the current property only has a single track driveway which can only accommodate two vehicles at most. The house is located at the end of a cul-de-sac where the road is too narrow to effectively turn a vehicle the size of a family car. The Parish Council would therefore request that vehicle access and additional parking provision is aligned to the increased occupancy rate.

- Installation of new telecommunications dish to be installed internally on new support pole and removal of existing dish (Revised Scheme of 24/01820/PLB & 24/01819/PLF) - Water Tower, Tranby Croft, Tranby Ride, Anlaby -GRANTED
- Variation of Condition 3 (first floor window) and Condition 5 (approved plans) of planning permission 24/01759/PLF (Erection of single storey extension with solar panels to rear following demolition of existing extensions, installation of first floor window to side, construction of hip to gable roof extension with installation of roof lights to front, construction of dormer window to rear and erection of single storey extension to existing detached garage) to allow design modifications to single storey rear extension including alteration from flat roof to mono-pitch roof and reduction to width size 29 Tranby Lane, Anlaby GRANTED

- c) <u>Daffodil Bulbs</u> Agreed to purchase two 20kg bags of daffodil bulbs at a cost of £70.79 including VAT.
- d) New bench Wilson Street Anlaby Permission had been granted by East Riding of Yorkshire Council to install a seat adjacent to the bus shelter on Wilson Street, Anlaby. The seat had been ordered. The Chairman signed the required indemnity form.

Administration and Communication

- a) Parish Council Website/Social Media and Communication Cllr. Slingsby reported that progress is being made on the provision of a .gov.uk domain. Further discussion is required regarding the cost implications of setting up individual email accounts for each Councillor. Clerk to provide Cllr. Jones with a quantity of newsletters for Sorbus View, Clerk to check with distributor that this street is included in deliveries.
- b) <u>Update and Approval of Clerk's Contract of Employment</u> An update to the Clerk's Contract of Employment was approved, specifically the removal of the former home address. The amended contract was signed by the Chairman.
- c) <u>Update Parish Council Vacancy</u> The Clerk reminded members that there is currently one vacancy on the Parish Council, with permission granted by East Riding of Yorkshire Council (E.R.Y.C.) to fill the vacancy by co-option. One application has been received, and another expression of interest has been noted.

Approval was given to progress these ideas, with oversight to be provided by Cllr. Smith. The purchase of one owl box, three bird boxes and one additional seat for the grounds was approved.
