What's happening in Your Area & Community Priorities



HUMBERSIDE POLICE turn 50 in April



Humber-talking has set our priorities, this month we are to:

- 1. Improving Road Safety
- 2. Reduce ASB improve the quality of life.
- 3. Tackle Rural Crime

Here's a summary of just some of the crimes that have been reported across all Wards last month:

Residential Burglary reports: (six investigations)

15/1/24 – Wolfreton Garth, Hanoi Burglary overnight after suspects remove four sets of car keys from victim's house by forcing entry to rear patio doors and steal victim's Audi from the driveway, enquiries ongoing.

16/1/24 – Carr Lane, entry gained to property after suspects force victim's lock to the rear door and gaining entry, once inside travel throughout the house stealing various items including work laptop. Enquiries ongoing.

17/1/24 – Bernadette Avenue, attempt entry to property after complainant have awoken and noticed that their rear door has been damaged, the handle casing and lock barrel have been cut/damaged, but no entry gained.

24/1/24 – Hull Road, theft from garage and pedal cycle stolen from within

24/1/24 – Delius Close, unknown suspects approach victim's garage which is at the rear of property and cut through the padlocks to gain entry, once inside steal numerous power tools.

24/1/24 – Tranby View, attempt entry to property after suspects use an unknown method to remove hinges from an upstairs window, leaving them on the windowsill, entry not gained.



Business burglary reports: (one investigation)

10/1/24 – St Marks Church, suspect gains entry via the toilet window at the side of the church, once inside an untidy search has been undertaken but nothing believed stolen.

Thefts: (three investigations)

8/1/24 – Sainsburys, Anlaby Road, shop theft, one adult male charged for offence.

19/1/24 – Workington Avenue, theft from vehicle, suspect named and enquiries ongoing.

24/1/24 – Waitrose, Willerby Shopping Park, shop theft

Damage: - (one investigation across Willerby & Tranby)

28/1/24 – Gorton Road, criminal damage caused to property/windows, enquiries ongoing.

Other (several other investigations) These include assault, harassment, and public order to name just a few.

You've no idea what's around the corner so slow down and give yourself time to react. Be ready to meet cyclists and slow-moving vehicles when you least expect them on rural roads.



If you're out for a country drive, look out for other road users. Don't forget to "LOOK, LOOK & LOOK AGAIN" for those on two wheels.

Remember to share the road and we ask drivers to look out for Walkers, Cyclists and Horse Riders – Give them plenty of room.



ACTION

As we leave winter and enter the spring months, our Policing Teams will continue to be out and about policing our roads.

2. Reduce ASB - Improve the quality of life in the community

This period is always one of our busiest, you will see a clear police presence on patrol in and around your neighbourhood over this period.

Action

Our Policing Teams works with our key partners and the community to reduce anti-social behaviour and the anti-social use of motor vehicles. We provide proactive responses to reports of anti-social behaviour in our neighbourhood Area and are constantly reviewing our patrol strategy to address this. We are working hard with partners to address this and ensure our market towns and rural communities are a safe place to live and work.



3. Tackling Rural Crime:

Rural crime is not limited to the farmyard. Serious and organised crime groups are often linked to rural and wildlife crime particularly in relation to theft of agricultural machinery and poaching like hare coursing. Our patrols are reminding farmers to review their security and to keep their properties/equipment safe. In relation to the security of Tractor GPS Receiver and Screens, please visit the Police website for crime prevention advice around MARK IT, REMOVE IT and LOCK IT.

ACTION: Operation GALILEO has restarted for the season. Throughout this year we have worked with volunteers on the Rural Watches across the whole of the East Riding to deter rural criminality. In addition, we will utilise all the available technology, crime prevention techniques and assistance from the Rural Crime Team to deter and detect crime.

How you can help

Your local Neighbourhood Policing Team appreciates the importance of being in the right place, at the right time, for the right reasons to reassure the public, improve public confidence and reduce crime and anti-social behaviour in the area in which we all live and work.

We encourage all residents to call and report any issues where they live so that we can deal with any issues and step up our patrols in that area.

If you feel that there are other issues affecting you or your local community that should be given priority, please inform your local councillors or your Neighbourhood Policing Team.

"My Community Alert" is a free messaging system operated by Humberside Police and Humberside Fire & Rescue Service, giving you information about incidents happening in your area. Choose how you often you want to hear from us and about the issues that matter to you.

Community Payback is a scheme that involves people who have been sentenced by the courts to do unpaid work in our communities to improve them. If you are a community organisation, you can have a say in where that work happens by nominating places that you feel would benefit from it.

It may be an alleyway that's full of rubbish that needs tidying up, wasteland requiring clearing, graffiti removing from walls or decorating your community centre, the jobs can be big or small. Our communities should be safer spaces for everyone, and Community Payback can help to make improvements.


Safety Crime Advice
